PALLIATIVE Care

Palliative care is a comprehensive treatment plan to help patients living with a serious, chronic, or life-threatening illness manage their symptoms more comfortably. It is implemented in tandem with a patient's primary medical treatment to help keep them as comfortable as possible, and improve their quality of life.

Patients do not have to be in hospice or endof-life care to receive palliative care services. Patients of all ages are able to receive care, whether their medical condition can or cannot be cured.

Our palliative care team of experts provide treatment for relief from: pain, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, weight loss, anxiety, problems with sleep, depression and a number of other ailments. Palliative care is appropriate for those who have difficulty managing their care, resulting in frequent hospital stays.

Our specialized hospice care team consists of experienced, compassionate clinicians that share a vision of achieving the best quality of life for individuals and their families, consistent with their values. Team members include:

- Medical Director trained in palliative care
- Hospice Nurses skilled in symptom assessment and pain management
- Social Workers experienced in emotional support and planning
- Spiritual Coordinator
- Specially-trained Home Health Aides
- Bereavement Counselors
- Physical, Occupational, and Speech Therapists
- Hospice Care Team to coordinate medication, therapies, equipment, or supplies necessary to maintain patient comfort

Hospice care is covered through Medicare, Medicaid, most private insurance plans, The Department of Veteran Affairs, HMOS, and other managed care organizations. Palliative care is paid for by Medicare, Medicaid and most private insurances.
